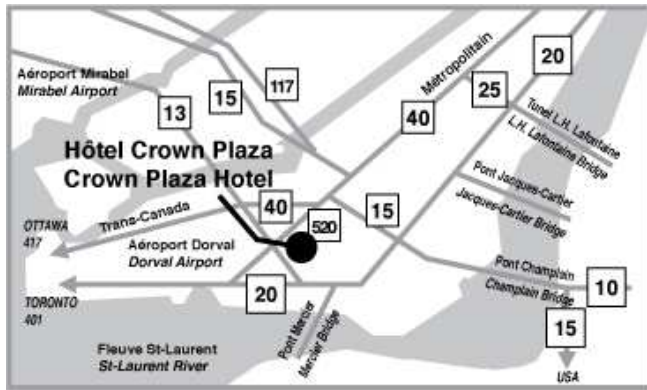

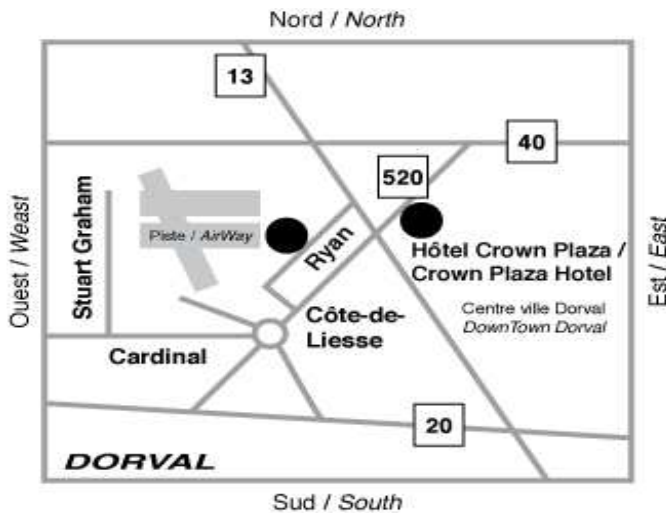

MONTREAL REGION ROAD MAP



DEPARTURES FROM MONTREAL - AIR ROUTE

Service will be assured by CONVAIR 580 turbo prop aircraft. Departure from Montreal is scheduled for **07:00 AM**. Hunters should meet us in the rear parking lot of Crown Plaza Hotel at 6600 Cote de Liesse, near Dorval Airport at **05:00 AM** to weight their luggage. A bus will pick you up at **06:30 AM** behind the hotel to escort you to the aircraft.



TRIP SCHEDULE - AIR ROUTE

Flight time to Caniapiscau is approximately 2½ hours. Out of town passengers are strongly suggested to allow for sufficient downtime time in their travel plans. Prior evening arrivals at Montreal are recommended.

Return flight from Caniapiscau will be in the early evening. Since occasional weather delays may **occur, passengers would be** prudent to book connecting flights out of Dorval no earlier than the next day.

LODGING IN MONTREAL - AIR ROUTE

The following special rate has been negotiated with the Crown Plaza Hotel (6600 Côte-de-Liesse - Route 520): (See map p.4)

Standard room (2 double-beds) \$125.00 CND + taxes/ for 2 persons \$15 additional for a folding bed.

Rates include shuttle service to and from Dorval Airport.

If you need a room for the night before departure, you have to make your reservation at your own charge as soon as possible (phone 514-735-7788, Fax 514-735-8515). We suggest the Crown Plaza Hotel to avoid being late in the morning at the meeting point. Reservation should be made directly at the hotel.

PARKING - AIR ROUTE

Free long term parking will be available at the Crown Plaza Hotel. We strongly suggest that a minimum be left in parked vehicles and that proper insurance coverage is subscribed to. Use only the long term parking lot. CLUB EXPLO-SYLVA INC. and Crown Plaza Hotel shall decline responsibility for any mishap brought upon your vehicle and/or its contents. Parking is at owner's exclusive risk.

MEETING OF INFORMATION FOR PACKAGES # 2-3-4 AND #5

For non residents staying at the Crown Plaza Hotel, an information meeting will be held by a representative from Club Explo Sylva between 7h00 pm and 8h00 pm on the evening before the day of departure at the hotel will be held behind the parking lot of the hotel.

TRAVELLING TO MONTREAL

Customs Canada may ask you for a valid passport. The serial numbers of your rifle, bow, binoculars, camera or other valuable items will be important for registration with US customs or any other customs before leaving your country.

By plane - For packages # 2-3-4 and 5

Upon your arrival at the Dorval Airport, use the hotel key board to call the shuttle; you will see the Crown Plaza Hotel under # **150**.

FOR PACKAGE #2, #3, #4 & 5

ATTENTION: Only if you are travelling by plane from your house to Montreal, please ask your airline company how many weight allowances for your meat & your trophy's transportation and at the same time ask them if you can bring these with you.

By car

In Canada, speed limit is indicated in kilometres and you must wear your seat belt. (back and front of seat)

50 km = 30 miles/hour • 100 km = 60 miles/hour

Park your car or truck only in the long term parking lot of the hotel.

Do not leave valuables in it.

PASSPORT NEED

Since early 2007, all persons need a passport to enter the US by air. However, starting January 31st, 2008, everybody entering by land or water will have to show a passport. To get the most recent updates on this, see the Canada Border Services Agency's website: www.asfc.gc.ca.

PACKAGE #1 - BY THE ROAD

Customers who drive themselves to meet us at the Caniapiscau base will have to be there on the date written on their confirmation and not later than 07:00 AM. Those clients can sleep at the base on the night before **without any extra charge**; however the meals at the cafeteria **are not included**. To assure you of a pleasant and safe trip, we strongly suggest that you meet the other members of your group and take note of the information that was sent to your group leader in which you will find a suggested itinerary, a list of tourist attractions, and the location of gas stations, accommodations and restaurants. A road map is also given to each group leader.

TRANSPORTATION FROM CANIAPISCAU BASE TO THE HUNTING CAMPS

From Caniapiscau, flying to your hunting camp via a floatplane (Otter or Beaver) will take about an hour.

WEIGHT ALLOWANCE

Weight allowance per passenger is 110 pounds (50 kg) including food, guns, group's and personal gear for European plan hunters. American plan allowance is 60 pounds (27.16 kg) per hunter. Beer, Coca Cola and 7UP will be available at Caniapiscau BEFORE your floatplane departure.

IMPORTANT: Always respecting the weight limit above mentioned.

Return allowance per person is 60 pounds (27.16 kg.) of personal gear for the AMERICAN PLAN & EUROPEAN PLAN. Each hunter is allowed to come back with 3 meat boxes that are not exceeding 65 pounds (29.42 kg.) each and 1 whole set of antlers or 2 splits antlers.

EXCESS WEIGHT AND EXTRA ANTLERS

a) Round-trip Montreal/ Caniapiscau:

Excess weight:

- \$3.00 Can. per pound on all excess weight.
- Your package includes transportation of **one full rack or 2 split ones**.
- Second rack: (if the first one is a full rack):
- \$50.00 Can. for a split rack.
- \$100.00 Can. for a complete rack.
- Excess weight and second rack fees must be paid in advance and will be transported only pending on sufficient capacity.

b) Base camp to outpost

If capacity is available, no extra fare shall be charged. However, the cost of an extra chartered aircraft shall be at hunter's expense.

CARRY-ON BAGGAGE

Due to limited capacity space, carry-on baggage should be of a limited size and weighing a maximum of 12 pounds (**included in your total weight limit**). Guns, ammunition, knives, lighter and all other potential weapons must not be transported in carry-on baggage. These should be stowed in your checked baggage.

GEAR BAGS

Gear bags must be sturdy and clearly identified with name, address and telephone number of owner with, if possible, a photo ID. No items shall be transported unless encased in a sturdy gear bag or case. Individual pieces should not exceed 60 lbs. Visual ID aids are strongly recommended. On the return trip, your meat boxes and antlers must be well identified with your name and group number.

GUNS AND AMMUNITION

Center fire rifles of a minimum 6mm (.243) are compulsory. Ammunition must be hunting grade with jacketed expanding bullets. Most popular are 150/180 grain in .308, 30.06, .270 and .300 mag. Bows must provide a minimum tension of 40 pounds (18.18 kg). Guns and bows must be stowed in a rigid case. Knives and ammunition should be lugged separate from weapons by law. Since these are not either allowed in your carry-on baggage, they shall necessarily be stowed in your gear bag.

CANADIAN FIREARMS LAW

All hunters residing outside Canada are required to fill out the form «non-resident firearm declaration form» enclosed with this booklet and give it to the Canadian custom agent or you can fill in the form and printing it at the following address: <http://www.rcmp-grc.gc.ca/cfp-pcaf/form-formulaire/pdfs/909.pdf>. Read the instructions carefully. For more information, please call the Canadian Firearms Center at 1-800-731-4000 or visit their web site under www.cfc-ccaf.gc.ca. Resident hunters must have with them their hunting certificate and their firearms acquisition certificate.

DO NOT SIGN THE FIREARM DECLARATION!!! Keep with you! You will need to sign it at the border in the presence of the custom agent and pay the \$25.00 CDN registration fee.

CANIAPISCAU BASE CAMP

Caniapiscou base camp is home to our air and route arrivals and departures as well as our outpost fly-in operations. This camp also provides with full living services such as showers, sleeping quarters, cafeteria, etc. Hunters will be commuted to their outpost camp, as soon as they get to Caniapiscou for the hunters who are coming by plane from Montreal, unless weather conditions prevent local flights.

On their return to Montreal, they will take the plane to be in Montreal on the same day. Meals at the Caniapiscou base are at the clients expenses.

PURCHASES AT CANIAPISCAU

All purchases must be made in cash only. No cheques or credit cards accepted.

LICENSES

Resident and non-resident licenses for caribou, black bear, fishing and small game will be issued at Caniapiscou. Costs are those indicated by the « MINISTÈRE DE L'ENVIRONNEMENT ET DE LA FAUNE » (see p.13).

Quebec residents must have a valid "Certificat du Chasseur" on hand for issue of the license.

Non-residents should be able to demonstrate their prior knowledge of firearm or bow safe handling. An old hunting license from home state or province is usually sufficient. **All licenses must be paid in cash only.**

AMERICAN PLAN PERSONNEL PACKAGES #4-5

American plan camps are manned by one cook and two guides who are responsible for maintenance of installations and equipment, garbage disposal, fire wood supply, cooking and communications. Guide will also dress, quarter and haul your kill. You will find 1 guide per 3 hunters in package #4, and 1 guide per 2 hunters in package #5.

MEALS (AMERICAN PLAN) PACKAGES #3-4 AND 5

Meals are standard North American food and are chosen to satisfy any clientele which has to show relatively important physical effort.

Please note that chips, peanuts, etc, soft drinks or beer, wine, liquor are not included in your package. Do not forget to advise your cook if you suffer of any kind of allergies.

HOUSEKEEPING PLAN CAMPKEEPER PACKAGES #1 & 2

A camp keeper is assigned to each European plan outpost. His functions are maintenance, garbage disposal, firewood and security. Subsequently only to accomplishment of these chores, may the keeper be solicited for extra chores such as capes, etc. Your keeper does not get paid by us for these extras; agree to something for him. Camp keeper's meals must be furnished out of your supplies.

COMMUNICATIONS

Each camp is equipped with a satellite phone for communication between the camp and the main lodge at Caniapiscau. Phone operation is strictly reserved to the outfitter personnel.

It will be possible for the hunters to make calls at \$5.00 CND per minute.

HUNTER ETHICS AND REGULATIONS

Here as in other sporting activities, a certain number of rules must be observed. Though some of these are not specifically made mandatory CLUB EXPLO-SYLVA INC. along with the « MINISTÈRE DE L'ENVIRONNEMENT ET DE LA FAUNE » would like to stress the following:

It is illegal to:

- Chase, mutilate or deliberately kill an animal with the use of an air, ground or marine vehicle.
- Hunt at night with a light.
- Use a light to locate game during the night.
- Shoot from an aircraft or ground vehicle.
- Capture or attempt to capture an animal using a device intended to restrain the animal in any way.
- Except for bear meat, abandon comestible meat. It is unsportsmanlike and unsafe to:
- Shoot at an animal while he is in the water.
- Use an aircraft to locate game.
- Use electronic tracking devices to locate game.
- Shoot at an animal while out of weapon's efficient range.
- Shoot at a target before it can clearly be identified.
- Attempt to encourage personnel to violate regulations.
- Abuse of the environment in any way.
- Not fully cooperate with game officials.

HUNTER ORANGE VEST

A hunter orange vest is required to be worn by all sportsmen while hunting. Vest should be of a hunter blaze orange color, lower back shoulders and chest should be covered. Vest should be worn as to be visible at all times. Never leave camp

without at least telling one person.

The fine for not wearing a blaze orange or reddish yellow garment can be up to \$500.00 CND.

SAFETY PRECAUTION AND RULES FOR EVERYONE

It is prohibited to:

- Hunt at night;
- Hunter under the influence of alcohol or while intoxicated;
- Hunt without fluorescent garments;
- Hunt with a crossbow;
- Abandon game after it has been shot or wounded;
- Chase, injure or kill an animal using a motor vehicle, an aircraft or motorized boat;
- Use tracer bullets or military type hard point bullets with non-flattening tips;
- Dispose of animal carcasses in lakes or rivers;
- Transport big game that has not been identified (the license tag must be affixed to the animal).

Remember to always carry matches or a lighter

We hope this will not happen to you, but if you do get lost, follow these three (3) important rules:

1. **DO NOT WALK:** Stay where you are! There will be some one looking for you.
2. **MAKE YOURSELF VISIBLE** From the air and the ground. Build a fire. Use anything that can be seen from the air and the land as a landmark.
3. **WEAR ORANGE**

DRESSING AND TRANSPORT OF MEAT

When you take a caribou, it should be dressed promptly and quartered for hauling to the nearest water, where it can be shipped back to camp along with the rack. A meat back-pack is the common tool for this chore.

Packages 1, 2 and 3 do not include that back-pack. Your caribou hunting license has two tags. You are required by law to tie each tag to your two caribou. These tags must remain on the animals during transportation. You will also have to register your caribou to your guide or camp steward. All outposts are equipped with an aerated meat house and cheese cloth for preservation.

We recommend that you sprinkle with pepper all hairless meat sections to prevent flies for nesting eggs. In package #1, you have to think of the transportation of your meat back home to keep it fresh.

TRANSPORT AND EXPORT OF FISH AND GAME

Individuals who have in their possession, other than in their place of permanent residence, fish caught while sport fishing, must keep such fish in a condition making it possible to determine the species (enough skin left in place for

identification), length (where length limits apply), and number. Non-residents may leave Quebec with a quantity of fish equal to the possession limit for each species.

Any hunter who has killed a caribou or black bear must immediately detach the appropriate transportation tag from his or her license and affix it to the animal. The tag must remain attached throughout the registration process and until the animal has been dressed and stored.

Anyone wishing to export black bear trophies, or any part of these animals, must obtain a CITES (Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Floral) export permit. Residents of the United States may export a black-bear trophy consisting of the hide, hide with paws and claws attached, skull or meat (excluding all organs) from Canada to the U.S. only on the condition that the animal is in a fresh, salted or frozen state, the result of their own hunting activity, and transported as personal accompanied baggage (not shipped). For a CITES export permit, please visit the web site: www.cites.ec.gc.ca

CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

Personal effects not subject to particular restrictions are exempt from taxes but must be declared at Customs. Visitors who are at least 18 years old may bring into Québec 50 cigars, 200 cigarettes and 7 oz of tobacco, as well as 38,55 fl. Oz of spirits or 50,72 fl oz of wine or twenty-four 12 fl oz cans or bottles of beer. There are restrictions on imports of food products, plants, pets and firearms.

As of January 23, 2007, a new American law, the Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative (WHTI), requires anyone, including U.S. citizens, entering or re-entering the United States by air to have a passport or a NEXUS card when used at a NEXUS kiosk at designated airports. By June 1, 2009 or earlier, anyone, including U.S. citizens, entering or re-entering the United States by land or sea will need to have a passport or other appropriate secure document. At this point, only requirements for travel by air to the United States have changed. Americans can continue to use documents such as their birth certificates and government-issued photo identification (e.g. driver's license) to cross the Canada-U.S. border by land or sea until the WHTI is fully implemented. D.W.I. / CRIMINAL FILE

If any traveller has any criminal file, O.U.I., D.U.I. or D.W.I., or any other records with the authorities, it is his responsibility to inquire with the Canadian Custom. They will tell you all information about a Rehabilitation Permit and if your situation can be a problem to cross the border.

As well, those admissible to Canada must not have a criminal record; this includes any convictions for driving while intoxicated. A waiver of exclusion may be obtained from a Canadian consulate in the United States, but several weeks are required. There is a processing fee for the waiver. If you have questions about your eligibility to enter Canada, contact your nearest Canadian Embassy or Consulate or visit www.dfait-maeci.gc.ca/can-am.

TRAVELING WITH YOUNG HUNTERS

Due to international concern over child abduction, Canada has initiated additional requirements at arrival and departure points when children under 18 years old are not traveling with both parents. You may be prompted to furnish documentary evidence of the adults' relationship and permission of the parent (s) or legal

guardian before they will allow the child to cross the border. Single parents, grandparents or guardians traveling with children often need proof of custody or notarized letters from the other parent authorizing travel. These requirements are in addition to passport or proof of citizenship requirements.

MINOR TRAVELING WITH ONE PARENT

If a minor is traveling with only one parent, the absent parent is expected to provide notarized consent. If only one parent has legal custody, that parent should be prepared to provide a court order of child custody to airlines and international authorities.

MINOR WITH A DIFFERENT LAST NAME

If a minor traveling has a different last name from the mother and/or father, the parents should be prepared to provide evidence to airlines and official authorities, such as a birth certificate or adoption decree, to prove that they are the parents.

MINOR HAS ONE DECEASED PARENT

If one parent is deceased, a death certificate is required.

MINOR HAS ONE PARENT

If the birth certificate shows that the minor only has one parent, it will be sufficient to hold only a notarized copy of the birth certificate.

PRIOR TO CROSSING INTO CANADA

US citizens you will need to fill out the CBP 4457 form (Certificate of registration for personal effects taken aboard) You can either stop at the US border office before crossing into Canada, get it at the airport before boarding your flight or download it from the web at:

www.cbp.gov/linkhandler/cgov/toolbox/forms/4457.ctt/cbp_4457.pdf.

SHARING YOUR KILL

It is strongly suggested that sharing of meat amongst your party members be discussed prior to the expedition so as to avoid unnecessary arguments. Meat boxes are supplied free of charge (Dimensions: 12 in. high x 24 in. long x 16 in. wide).

COLD STORAGE

Your meat can be stowed at our Caniapiscou cold storage when and if necessary. There will be a refrigerated truck in the parking lot of the CROWN PLAZA HOTEL to keep your meat in for 24 hours. Please try to concentrate your trips to cooler in these establishments.

Cooling services are offered on a no-claim basis, as liability for loss of meat will be declined. It is each hunter's responsibility to care appropriately for his meat.

DRY ICE (MONTREAL ONLY)

Dry ice can be purchase on the spot in Montreal. The price is not fixed yet at the time of production of this document.

BUTCHER SHOP

Your meat can be butchered and packed in Montreal as well as frozen if required within 24 hours. Price is **\$85-CND** per animal with CRYOVAC special package (Vacuum pack).

Please inform our Caniapiscou personnel of your requirements. Your contact in Montreal is Boucherie Himbault 1-450-377-1128.

TAXIDERMY

Taxidermy service is available and delivery is guaranteed within 5 months anywhere in Canada, U.S.A. and Europe. For more information: Patrice Boisvert (819) 399-2997.

BEAR

If you intend to hunt bear, you must remind two important points:

- A bear hunting permit is compulsory. It can be obtained in any Quebec sports shop specialized in fishing and hunting or at our Caniapiscau base for the price of \$47.75 CND for Quebec residents and \$147.51 CND For non-residents (including taxes). Payable in cash before you leave for your hunting camp.
- You must complete and sign at our Caniapiscau base the forms prescribed by the « MINISTÈRE DE L'ENVIRONNEMENT ET DE LA FAUNE ».

Furthermore, if your residence is located out of America, and you want to bring, or ship, capping or any other part of the animal, **you must complete and sign, at Caniapiscau**, the Application for the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES). **Otherwise, your trophy cannot cross the borders nor be processed by any taxidermist, local or foreign, and even can lead to legal actions.**

BAG LIMITS AND SEASON

The following bag limits and seasons are enforced by the « MINISTÈRE DE L'ENVIRONNEMENT ET DE LA FAUNE ». For more detail refer to publications of the « MINISTÈRE DE L'ENVIRONNEMENT ET DE LA FAUNE » available in all sporting goods stores.

We are listing the main activities allowed in the Zone 23. If you need more information, consult the booklets on the subject published by the « MINISTÈRE DE L'ENVIRONNEMENT ET DE LA FAUNE ».
